





KUMITE RULES

Tournament Director has the right to combine or split divisions 3 or 5 Judges/Referees

Kumite Tournament Rules

USANKF/WKF modified rules. All techniques to the face, head, and neck must have absolute control. The referee panel will penalize the competitor if the hand techniques touch the face, neck, or head for all 15 years old and younger. Light skin touch with a foot is allowed for all divisions. Age 16 and up (non-injurious, "light skin touch") with a hand is allowed.

Kumite Matches

1.5 MINUTES stop time 8 points ceiling for all divisions except 18-34 Advanced

3 MINUTES stop time 8 points spread 18-34 Advanced

*ALL KUMITE DIVISIONS WILL USE REPECHAGE SYSTEM

Mandatory equipment:

White Karate-Gi (red and blue lettering is allowed, dojo patch is allowed) WKF style Leather fist guard (Red and Blue preferred, White is allowed) WKF style Foot/Shin Guards (Red and Blue preferred, White is allowed) Mouth guard

Groin cup (boys only)

Optional equipment:

Headgear, WKF Face mask, Chest Protector (female), and body protector



KATA RULES

Beginner and Novice Divisions

Competitors perform simultaneously, two at a time in all rounds.

Competitors may perform only kata from the 2025 USANKF beginner/novice kata list (refer to the next page).

Competitors may repeat kata in all rounds.

NO REPECHAGE SYSTEM WILL BE USED

Intermediate Divisions

Competitors perform simultaneously, two at a time in all rounds.

Competitors may perform only kata from the 2025 USANKF intermediate kata list (refer to the next page).

Competitors may repeat kata in all rounds.

NO REPECHAGE SYSTEM WILL BE USED

Advanced Divisions

Competitors perform simultaneously, two at a time in all rounds.

Competitors may perform any kata from the 2025 USANKF kata list as well as all kata listed on the WKF Official Kata List.

In all Advanced categories, of every age category, competitors <u>must perform a kata different from the previous round.</u>

The flag system will be used.

USA KARATE SANCTIONED EVENT

What does it mean?

PURPOSE

Our goal is to offer you a karate tournament that will be one of the best organized, high-quality, fair, and safe events in the coutnry, endorsed by USA Karate.

RANKING EXPLAINED

USA Karate uses a National Ranking System (NRS) for all athletes under 18 years of age competing in sanctioned events. Athletes will be ranked using the ranking points for the competitive category they are in. Promoters will be required to report results from each category to USA Karate within 5 days of the competition of the sanctioned event. Once the results are reported from the promoter, USA Karate will update the NRS and post to the USA Karate websites and social media pages.

Athlete Ranking Points are awarded based on event level as follows:

^{*}Level 4 events are reserved for USA Karate Signature Events and hold the highest points value.

In addition to awarding ranking points for participating athletes, USA Karate will award ranking points for participating Referees. These points will help USA Karate recognize referees and judges who are the most active and supportive of USA Karate sanctioned events. These ranking points will be used for recognition awards and may be used by USA Karate to identify future leaders in the USA Karate Referee Corps.

Referee Ranking Points are awarded based on event level as follows:

- Level 1 events are awarded 100 points to each participating referee/judge.
- Level 2 events are awarded 200 points to each participating referee/judge.
- **!** Level 3 events are awarded 300 points to each participating referee/judge.
- Level 4 events are reserved for USA Karate Signature Events and hold the highest point value. Participating referee/judges will be awarded 600 points.

USA KARATE MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

All participants in USA Karate sanctioned events must be members of the NGB.

Participants include:

- **❖** All competing athletes
- ❖ All officiating referees and judges
- Event promoter(s)
- ❖ Volunteer Coordinator

Volunteer staff are not considered participants and do not need to be members of USA Karate.

All participants, including referees and judges, must have a minimum of a Level 2 - Local Competitive Membership (Cost: \$30 annually) to participate in Level 1-3 sanctioned events. Memberships must be obtained directly from USA NKF and cannot be purchased from sanctioned event promoters.

USA KARATE MEMBERSHIP BENEFITS

All membership levels come with a range of benefits designed to support and enhance your involvement in the sport of karate. These benefits include:

- Insurance Coverage: Benefit from the Individual Member Insurance Benefit, providing up to \$100,000 in coverage with a \$250 deductible.
- Access to Information: Stay informed with the USA Karate newsletter, bulletins, and member meetings.
- * Training Opportunities: Participate in USA Karate sanctioned training camps, workshops and interact with National Coaches and Trainers.
- * Competition Access: Depending on your membership level, compete in local, regional, national, and international events.
- **&** Certification and Recognition: Achieve USA Karate Dan Certification and gain recognition within the karate community.
- Support and Community: Be part of a supportive community of karate enthusiasts, coaches, referees, and athletes.
- *Voting Privileges: Have a voice in your sport. Members are allowed to vote on difference leadership and representative positions held throughout USA Karate

TOURNAMENT REGISTRATION

All participants, including athletes, coaches, referees, and judges are required to register using the USA Karate events software www.tournamentinabox.com in advance of the sanctioned event. This process allows USA Karate to verify membership and SafeSport requirements needed to ensure a safe and proper event. The official USA Karate event software automatically checks membership and SafeSport status of the participant against the USA Karate database to ensure a valid membership and SafeSport status.



APPENDIX A

The USA Karate Safe Sport Program consists of online SafeSport™ Training, background screening and a collection of policies to protect our members. SafeSport™ Training and background screening must be completed for each USA Karate Official, Coach, Adult National Team Member, Committee Member, Staff and Board Member. Athletes 18 years and over are required to complete SafeSport™ Training. Volunteers and Vendors are required to review the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies At-A-Glance and the Reporting At-A-Glance. Those who have not completed the program requirements or who are on the banned list will not be allowed to participate in any capacity at any USA Karate Sanctioned Event.

Who Needs to Complete SafeSport & Background Screening

Any participant at a Sanctioned event who is 18 years old or older. This includes, but is not limited to:

- Tournament Director
- Volunteer Director
- Referee Director
- All officials/referees 18 years or older
- All coaches 18 years or older
- All medical staff
- All press credential holders who will have "field of play" access
- Athletes ages 18 years or older (Only SafeSport)

How to Complete SafeSport training & Background Screening

- 1. Create a profile in our membership site https://usankf.sport80.com
 - **a.** If you are a volunteer, medical staff, or press you can use the free membership called club participant. You will receive an ID number that you will use when



registering. Tournament In A Box will not complete the registration until everything is current.

- 2. Click on the Center for SafeSport section
 - a. Click on +Access Core Training. Additional training is optional. Core is the required training. After completing Core, the following year you will be able to complete a refresher course.
 - **b.** No need to print your certificate. Your results are saved in your Sport80 profile.
- 3. For background screening click on the background screening section
 - a. Then click add background screening
 - **b.** There are two options, domestic and international. Background screenings are good for 2 years. Background screenings are done through NCSI.
 - **c.** This may take some time so please submit your screening requests at least 30 days before the event.

Who Does NOT Need to Complete SafeSport & Background Screening

- Volunteers
- Vendors
- Officials/referees under the age of 18 years
- Athletes under the age of 18 years
- Spectators



SafeSport FAQ

1. I just want to volunteer for a couple of hours at my child's karate tournament. Do I need to complete the SafeSport training?

No. All that is required is that you register with your email so that the tournament director can email you a copy of the MAAPP and reporting requirements/methods if a violation is seen. You are, however, required to have reviewed the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies At-A-Glans and the Reporting At-A-Glance materials in advance of your participation at the event.

2. I am a Jr. Instructor under the age of 18 and I am going to be a referee at our local tournament. Am I required to complete the SafeSport training?

No. Only those 18 and older are required to complete the SafeSport training. We do suggest that you take the SAFESPORT® FOR YOUTH ATHLETES (AGES 13-17) course which focuses on consent and respectful behavior, supporting friends who have experienced abuse or misconduct, and resources for reporting. Parental consent required at the start of course.

3. Where can I find the SafeSport training?

SafeSport training can be found at USA Karate's membership site https://usankf.sport80.com

4. My SafeSport training will expire right before the tournament date, can I take it early?

Yes. You can access the training up to a month early. Just click on the "green current" circle in the SafeSport section of your profile.

5. I have completed SafeSport with another sport. Is it possible for it to be current with USA Karate?

Yes. Please email the office at <u>natoffice@usankf.org</u> and they will be able to get profile merged with your other sport.

6. How do I know if my SafeSport is expired?

Log into your profile in USA Karate's Sport80 membership site. In the Center for SafeSport section, you will either see "current" or "lapsed".
